Kindergarten and First Grade

Plants and Animals of the Piedmont

Second and Third Grades

The themes are the interdependence of plants and animals within the Piedmont ecosystem and the impact of natural processes and human activities on plant and animal life. The visit includes a walk in the garden and on the nature trail. Program lasts two hours.

Piedmont Ecology

Fourth and Fifth Grades

The theme is the Piedmont ecosystem, from its natural state to the present day, focusing on the impact of human activity on the Piedmont ecosystem over time. The visit includes a walk in the garden and on the nature trail. Program lasts two hours.

Plants Around the World

Third and Fifth Grades

The themes are how plants adapt to diverse world environments; genetic characteristics of plant groups; and plant culture. The visit includes a walk in the garden and greenhouses. Program lasts an hour and fifteen minutes.

Stream Ecology

Fifth Grade

This hands-on session will focus on the study of macroinverte-brates and stream ecology. We will assess the water quality of water resources present at Reynolda using a leaf pack collection method. Students will learn to identify and observe living things found in these resources and collect data to assess the health of each resource. Program last two hours. One session or two.
