

## **Reynolda Gardens Tomato Sale**

**April 17, 2018**

**5:30 pm to 6:30 pm**

**ARGG, Aunt Ruby's German Green:** Family heirloom from Ruby Arnold of Greeneville, Tennessee. Introduced to SSE in 1993 by Bill Minkey of Darien, Wisconsin. Large beefsteak fruits weigh one pound or more. Sweet juicy flesh with a hint of spiciness. Ready to harvest when soft to the touch and yellow-green in color. Indeterminate, 80-95 days from transplant.

**BC, Black Cherry:** Vigorous regular leaf plants covered in clusters of 1" round cherry tomatoes. Dusky purple-black fruits bursting with rich flavor—sweet and complex. Indeterminate, 65-75 days from transplant.

**BFT, Black from Tula:** Russian variety imported by SSE from seedswoman Marina Danilenko. First listed in the 1996 SSE Yearbook. Described by one SSE member as “the ugliest, most delicious tomato I've ever grown.” Good yields of brownish-red slightly flattened globes weighing up to 14 ounces. Rich full flavor, great for slicing and canning. Indeterminate, 75-85 days from transplant.

**BK, Black Krim:** (aka Black Crimea) Introduced to SSE by Lars Olov Rosenstrom of Sweden. Originally from Krim, Russia. Beefsteak fruits are a unique combination of violet-brown and purple-red—they turn almost black with sufficient sunlight and heat. Excellent full flavor. Indeterminate, 70-90 days from transplant. ±9,500 seeds/oz.

**BB, Brandy Boy:** (hybrid) A huge pink beefsteak tomato with incredible heirloom flavor and very high yields.

**B, Brandywine:** (pink) large pink beefsteak fruits grow up to 2 pounds. Rich, delightfully intense tomato flavor Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season 90 days from transplant.

**CP, Cherokee Purple:** Dusty rose-brown fruits grow to 12 ounces. Sweet flavor Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season 75-90 days from transplant.

**H, Hillbilly Potato leaf:** Yellow skin with red on the blossom end, Juicy and sweet fruits grow to 1 pound Beautiful bicolor beefsteak is great for slicing. Heavy producer. Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season. 85 days from transplant.

**JB, John Baer:** Red, round fruits with good flavor. Very productive. Once a leading canning variety, also great for fresh eating. Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season 60-80 days from transplant.

**MP, Missouri Pink Love Apple:** Pink beefsteak tomatoes grow with 1-3 fruits per cluster. Slightly sweet flavor. Flesh has a juicy, meaty texture. Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season. 75-85 days from transplant.

**MG, Moonglow:** Winner of SSE's 2007 Tomato Tasting. Uniform, orange globe-shaped fruit. Mild sweet flavor, Solid flesh with few seeds. Excellent keeper. Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season. 85 days from transplant.

**SH, Steak House:** (hybrid) Big news in the tomato patch! Meet the biggest tomato ever bred. And it's not just bigger but better. Tipping the scales at up to three lbs. plus, broad-shouldered tomato titan is bigger than Big Daddy, and loaded with true heirloom tomato flavor and head-spinning fragrance. Indeterminate plants produce gorgeous, humongous fruits.

**S, Sungold:** One taste and you'll know why this gold gem gets such high marks. The sweet-tart flavor is simply amazing. The beautiful golden-orange fruits are borne in large clusters. The flavor develops early, so this little tomato is great for snacking a week before full maturity, when it becomes very sweet and delicious.

**SS, Supersteak: (hybrid)** Our favorite super-size tomato-with most fruits weighing in at 2 lb. Burpee bred, this is the original with "beefsteak" flavor and meaty texture.

**T, Trophy:** Round, red fruits grow to 5-7 ounces. Sweet flavor, Ideal for slicing Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season. 80 days from transplant.

**UP, Ukrainian Purple:** Plum-shaped fruits are purple-red. Fruits grow to 3-4 inches long and 6 ounces. Flavorful, sweet, meaty flesh, resistant to cracking. Very productive Indeterminate - Fruit ripens throughout the season. 80 days from transplant.
